We are proud to welcome another close associate of Serge Koussevitzky's to our distinguished Advisory Board. Frederick Fennell takes his place alongside Antonio de Almeida, Martin Bookspan, David Diamond, Harry Ellis Dickson, Charles Dutoit, Mrs. Irving Fine, Lukas Foss, Karl Haas, Richard L. Kaye and William Schuman. Mr. Fennell has generously agreed to record an interview for our newsletter early next year.

Meanwhile, Advisor Karl Haas has received the Charles Frankel Prize from the National Endowment for the Humanities. This annual award recognizes five Americans for their work in increasing the public's understanding of history and other topics in the humanities. Others receiving this year's prize were Ken Burns, best known as the producer of the critically-acclaimed Civil War miniseries; Winton Blount, business leader; Louise Cowan, co-founder of the Dallas Institute of Humanities and Culture; and John Kuo Woi Tchen, cofounder of the Chinatown History Museum.

Congratulations to Mark Obert-Thorn. His excellent set of two Pearl compact discs (GEMM CDS 9408), "Koussevitzky Conducts Sibelius," has been nominated for a Gramophone Award in the "Historical—Non-Vocal" category. His "Prokofiev Plays Prokofiev" CD (also on Pearl) was nominated in the same category. Bravo, Mark!

We may, at long last, have the first all-Koussevitzky CD from RCA. Jon Samuels has just completed transfers of two Tchaikovsky items—the 1930 *Pathétique Symphony* and the 1936 *Romeo & Juliet*. According to Mark Obert-Thorn, Samuels is known for his excellent work, and the CD should be available within the next few months. Given the rave reviews and brisk sales of the Pearl CDs, dare we hope for a complete *Koussevitzky Edition* from RCA?

This issue of our newsletter is devoted to a complete listing of Serge Koussevitzky's commercial recordings, both as conductor and double-bassist. I have endeavored to make this discography as "user-friendly" as possible. Each listing includes the date the recording was made, the number of the original issue, all subsequent American LP numbers, and all compact disc issues.

Please note that the composers of two works were incorrectly identified when their recordings were origi-

nally issued. The "K.P.E. Bach Concerto for Orchestra" will be found under Henri Casadesus and "Haydn's *Toy Symphony*" is listed as the work of Leopold Mozart. Only two of Koussevitzky's many recordings have never been published. The Corelli Suite for Strings is a lovely performance that ought to be issued by RCA at the earliest opportunity. Unfortunately, rumor has it that the masters of the only other unpublished item, the Adagio from Mozart's String Quintet in G Minor, were destroyed. I've been unable to reach anyone at RCA who could either confirm or deny this story.

In addition to the unpublished items above, there exist unissued versions of several works which Koussevitzky ultimately re-recorded. These include all six double-bass selections, the Khachaturian Piano Concerto and the First *Brandenburg Concerto* of Bach. Since these earlier "takes" were ultimately rejected by Koussevitzky, they are not included in this discography.

Also not included this time around are the "pirate" recordings. Unlike many American orchestras, the Boston Symphony has jealously guarded its recorded heritage. This has kept the number of Koussevitzky pirates in circulation to a minimum, and consequently the prices of these collector's items stay unnaturally high. The discs that have been available include matchless performances of several works that Koussevitzky never recorded commercially. The list includes symphonies by Shostakovich, Bruckner, Sibelius, Rachmaninov and Brahms, not to mention Bartók's Concerto for Orchestra. In general, Koussevitzky's live performances display an energy and fire that even the best of the commercial recordings can only occasionally equal.

A complete listing of the pirates is in preparation, and your help is requested. The Koussevitzky Recordings Society was established in 1986, and we are dedicated to the preservation and dissemination of the recorded legacy of Serge Koussevitzky. The Society is a non-profit corporation, which is staffed entirely by volunteers.

The Society is involved in a variety of projects, including the creation of an "oral archive" of conversations with those who knew and worked with Koussevitzky and an archive of the conductor's recorded performances. The activities of the Society are highlighted in our bi-annual newsletters. These include interviews from the oral archive, articles about the conductor, and book reviews.
